ROLE OF A PROVINCIAL ENVIRONMENTAL OFFICER

- An Environmental Officer (EO) is a Provincial Officer, Provincial Offences Officer and a Peace Officer who is granted <u>legal authority</u> under environmental legislation in Ontario, such as:
 - Ontario Water Resources Act;
 - Environmental Protection Act;
 - Nutrient Management Act;
 - Safe Drinking Water Act...
- Conduct Inspections to assess compliance
- Respond to spills Part X EPA Responsibilities
- Work with companies to find solutions to problems
- EO duties performed according to the "Regulators Code of Practice"

INSPECTION POWERS OF A PROVINCIAL EO



- Inspect
- Require production of records/documents
- Record information
- Take and analyze samples
- Require thing to be operated
- Issue Provincial Officers Orders
- Make inquiries

- Exclude persons
- Stop vehicles
- Remove documents and data for copying
- Secure things or places
- Make excavations
- Request/require assistance of the Police

INSPECTION POWERS OF AN EO



- An EO may, without a warrant:
- Enter:
 - Any part of the natural environment to assess adverse effect
 - Any place where a thing which is regulated by an Act can be found
 - Any place it is believed a contaminant is being/had been/will be discharged into the natural environment
 - Any place it is believed is subject to the Act or regulations or is exempt by a regulation

INSPECTION POWERS OF AN EO - CON'T



- Any place that is likely to contain documents relating to an activity subject to the Act or regulations or activity exempted by a regulation
- Any place a motor vehicle or beverage container regulated under the Act may be found, to carry out the duties under Part III or IX
- Any ice shelter, abandoned vehicle
- Any place where a permit or plate may be found
- Any place adversely impacted by a spill

INSPECTION POWERS OF AN EO - CON'T



- It is an offence to
 - Issue false statements to an EO
 - Provide false information in a report
 - Interfere with an EO's ability to conduct their duties
- EO's cannot enter a "dwelling"

WHY MIGHT YOUR FACILITY BE INSPECTED?



- To evaluate compliance with environmental laws or the conditions of an approval (ECA, EASR)
- To conduct a routine/planned site inspection
- In response to a complaint, or a referral from another agency
- A follow-up inspection
- To assess a spill or environmental incident

HOW TO PREPARE FOR AN INSPECTION

- Know all aspects of your facility's operation (or bring others that do!)
- Know what approvals or permits your site has/requires
- Keep environmental records organized and ready
- Mnow what consultants/suppliers/contractors are doing on your behalf
- Provide accurate answers to the EO (if you don't know, don't guess/find out)
- ? If YOU have questions.... ASK!



- Industrial Sewage
- Permit to Take Water



- Air/Noise (Reg. 419)
- Sanitary Sewage
- Water Treatment Plant (drinking water)
- Biosolids



- Properties of Environmental Concern
- Waste Disposal Site (non-haz)
- Pesticides

WHEN AN EO ARRIVES, THEY WILL..



- Identify themselves
- Ask to speak to the person in charge, facility operator or environmental coordinator
- Explain the purpose of the inspection
- Conduct the Inspection
- Conduct a debrief to discuss key findings

DURING THE INSPECTION



The EO will collect information to evaluate compliance, and make notes to record details of the inspection

The EO may:

- Ask to interview staff
- Tour the facility No Warrant required!

 Collect so-
- Take photographs
- Copy documents

DURING THE INSPECTION CON'T FOR THE MECP

During the inspection, an EO may look at:

- Facility operations
- No Warrant required! Waste management systems
- Air/noise discharges
- Wastewater discharges
- Pollution control equipment
- Water treatment and distribution systems
- Stormwater/drainage systems







Ontario


An EO has the authority to access and copy relevant records, such as:


- Process/equipment information
- Operation log books
- Equipment maintenance records
- Environmental reports
- Analytical results or records
- Waste Manifests, etc...

INSPECTION VS. INVESTIGATION FOR THE MECP







Investigation



- Purpose: to <u>determine</u> compliance with applicable rules and regulations
- Not about laying charges
- Enforcement action or IEB referral when noncompliance is found
- Purpose: to determine if the possibility for penal liability exists
- About gathering evidence to determine if reasonable and probable grounds exist
- If so → charges laid



INSPECTION VS. ENFORCEMENT

Things to ASK the officer:

- Are you here collecting evidence for the purposes of a prosecution?
- Are you here for an inspection or for the purposes of an investigation
- Record responses
- Develop procedures for interacting with provincial officers
- TRAIN all personnel that may be required to interact with EOs or IEB or other inspectors/investigators
 - Security guards
 - Gatehouse personnel

Enforcement





